President's Message, March 2018

In the last Trail Talk I mentioned that Dave Hardy, the long-time Green Mountain Club director of Trail Programs, had passed away after a year-long struggle with cancer. Jim Fritz and I attended a celebration of Dave's life in Waterbury Center, Vermont in early January. Despite below-zero temperatures, the turnout of Dave's family, friends and current and former co-workers was enormous. There were several speakers, all of whom did an excellent job of painting a picture of a special person who was so thoroughly dedicated to trails throughout the Northeast. Carol Langley has coordinated with Dave's family in Connecticut to schedule a memorial hike at Sleeping Giant State Park in Hamden on Sunday April 8. We'll hike up the graded Tower Path and up the stone tower for a brief reflection on Dave's life. A longer loop hike will follow for those interested. In addition, the Connecticut Chapter of the Appalachian Mountain Club plans a trail work day in Dave's memory on Saturday May 12 as part of their "Give A Day to the AT" event. We're approaching Spring, which is a great time to get out and hike and wander in the woods. With warmer weather of course, our insect friends come alive. After a hike on the Nipmuck Trail in late February following the spell of abnormally warm weather, I found a tick starting to dine on my dog Molson and found another walking up my shirt.
